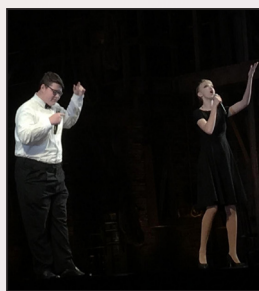
April 12 - Glowcoming

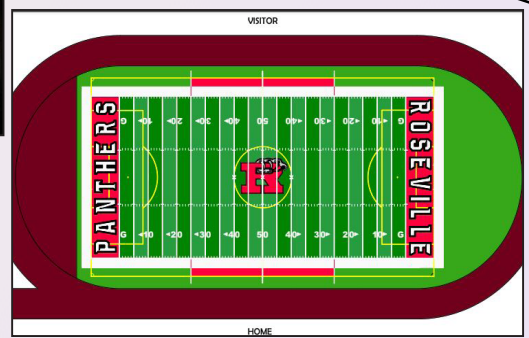
April 18 - Hamilton

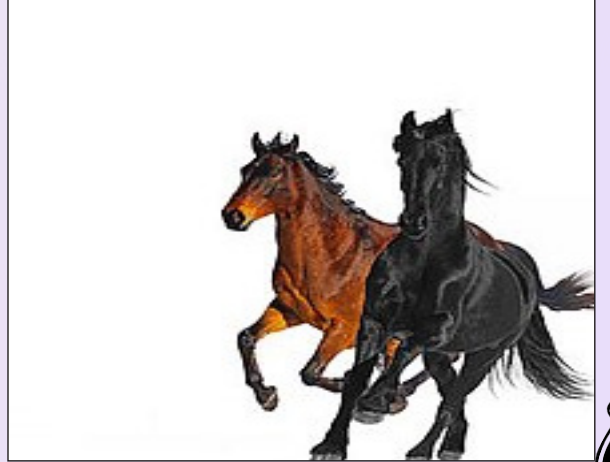
